HOW TO USE MEPILEX HEEL



1. **Prepare dressing** Remove the longer release film.



Fit to heel Fix the dressing under the foot. Remove the shorter release film. Mould the dressing around the heel and bring edges together. Mepilex Heel should overlap the wound bed by at least 2 cm onto the surrounding skin.



3. Secure in place

Hold Mepilex Heel securely in place with a light bandage or other dressing retention method (e.g. Tubifast or Mepore Film)
